



## Todd Coffman

“While most of the Class of 1986 were most likely half-way through college, Todd had started his own business, installing carpets in Anchorage. He also started a family. I worked for him a couple of summers. The work was hard as Todd was serious about his business but it was always fun. Todd always had a joke on standby. His true love was his children, and he adored them immensely. He’d play with his kids for hours on end, and they always had first priority in his life. Another thing Todd despised was the strong bullies who preyed upon the weak.” **Bob Barr**

“What I would like to say first and foremost is: Todd loved high school and all his friends, all the school activities and extracurricular events. Even though he left my home before the 8th grade, and it broke my heart to let him stay, he was so happy in Alaska I had to let him stay. He loved sports, weight lifting, and people.

Other than the births and lives of his three children, his happiest years were spent at Bartlett High School. I have some of his football games on tape, and a lot of pictures, thanks to Bob Barr who is one of the nicest people on earth. He gave me back the years of Todd’s life I lost when I let him stay in Alaska. He made me an album with over 100 pictures of Todd on baseball cards with titles, years, and notes on the back. I am forever grateful to Bob Barr.



His life was too short, and I want everybody to know he died as a result of domestic violence. He let a friend of his girlfriend’s stay at his place to keep from being beaten. Two men busted in his house and beat the girl, he threw them out, and they came back in and Eric Carlsen took a gun and shot Todd in the back, and when he was on the floor, he shot him in the stomach two times. The Bible says “Greater love hath no man than this; that he lay down his life for his friends.” (John 15:13) That is the epitaph on Todd’s headstone with his photo, along with engraved Alaskan scenery and animals, buried in Hot Springs, Arkansas.



I am grateful to Dawn Dalton for her web page, and the pictures she so generously used in memory of Todd. It gives me pleasure to look, and it is marked on my computer as a favorite. I often look at the web site and see if anybody else has died too young. I also look to see if anybody else has posted a story or memory about Todd. Dawn’s page is the only lasting memorial for my son. At one time Todd’s twins (now 16) went online and typed in their Dad’s name. They found the web site, and I think they are soothed in a way, that he is remembered. Thanks to Dawn.

I can’t begin to tell you how much I miss him. I will always miss him, and I want to ask each of you to do something for me and for Todd. Todd and I never had words, he loved me unconditionally as I love both my children. But if any of you are not speaking to your parents/family for any reason because of bad words, etc., do not hesitate. Write that person or call that person, and just tell them you still love them, no matter what. I learned in one horrible evening, October 1, 1998, that life is short, so live and love for today. Tell everyone you love that you love them, tell them often.

I will close with one of Todd’s favorite things to do in public, “Hey, everybody, Bob’s here. Hey, Bob!!!!” Bobby Barr was one of Todd’s everlasting friends, as was Dawn. PS His kids think he was “buff”, he was!” **Ginger, Todd’s Mom.**






## Larry Andrews




### **Miguel Cardozatobar**

## Leslie Zimmer (Olson)






## Jeff Ostrom


## Brian Petro



I have been working as a self employed tax accountant since 1994, raising a family, traveling as often as possible, and living in Alaska (still).



## Terry Sniff (Shively)



### **Cyle Sprick**




### **Michelle DeJean (Stanfield)**

## David Vozka






## Karen Perkins (Wasserzieher)
